Other News...

Homework in September

In September we will be changing how we organise homework and amalgamating class homework with Creative Homework. Each term the children will be set a 'Homework Trail' by their teacher. The trail will include some 'Base Camp' tasks that need to be completed each week—this includes learning spellings or phonics (depending on year groups), reading practice and for years 2—6, times tables practice. It also includes an online maths homework activity which will be set each week. We will no longer be using the 'My Maths' programme but will instead be introducing 'Mathletics' a more engaging, interactive maths package.

The children will then be able to choose which homework activities they complete each term from a 'Homework Trail' of 9 options centred around their Learning Adventure topic. At least one of these tasks will be a creative task which will give the children free rein to explore an idea in an imaginative way—the same way we currently do with Creative Homework. The children must complete at least 3 tasks from the grid over the course of a term. Those children who want to challenge themselves can go for the 'Extra Mile' award and complete 6 tasks from the grid.

At the start of each new term, the children will return all completed homework to school and will have a homework showcase when, in class, they will view each other's work and present the things they have done. A new trail will then be set for that term.

Every time the children complete an 'Extra Mile' challenge they will gain 5 House Points and if they complete 3 'Extra Mile' challenges in a year, they will be invited to a special film morning in Term 6.

Full details will be sent out to parents at the start of next academic year, including details about the Mathletics programme and login details. We hope that this will be an exciting way to engage children with homework tasks.

Summer Holiday Homework

The children will have brought home this week an invitation to take part in a summer holiday homework challenge. All children have been invited to produce a piece of work (artwork, model, piece of writing, poem, textile work, research) based around their class name which they will need to bring into school on the first day of term. We look forward to seeing all the exciting things that the children produce.

On this day, the children will be participating in team building activities with their class teacher as a way of getting to know each other.

Next year, we will be embarking on a 'Kindness Revolution' at Godinton—an opportunity for the children to embark on a series of activities and challenges designed to support and consider the needs of others both in our school and in the wider community. Some will link with STAR week, such as the community acts of kindness that the children undertook at Christmas last year and others will include us working with charity groups such as the NSPCC. We will also be participating in Ashford Vineyard's 1000 Hours of Kindness' project. More information will be revealed in the autumn.

In the meantime, I hope that you will join us in kickstarting our Kindness Project by donating items for Hygiene Bank. Hygiene Bank is a national, grass roots, community-powered charity which helps families with hygiene, beauty and personal care essential in a similar way in which Food Bank operates.

Each hygiene bank, encourages its local community to donate items via drop off points. Products are then collected, sorted and distributed by partners working locally to families who would benefit from receiving such items. It hopes to be as successful as Food Bank has proved to be in supporting families with food essentials.

Godinton has been approved as a Hygiene Bank collection point so please help us to make this a success for the Ashford community. The collection point will be a permanent feature in the entrance foyer as of September, when you can donate items such as unopened and unused shampoos, soaps, bath and shower products, toothpaste toothbrushes, sanitary products, nappies, deodorants, shaving products or toilet paper-those essential items that would go onto your weekly shopping list which we often take for granted. Thank you for helping us to make a difference to our local community.
