## Weekly homework tasks

### Reading

Read or share a book at least five times a week. This could be your school reading book or a book from home.

### Mathletics

Tasks will be set on Mathletics each fortnight. You can use the games and challenges available on Mathletics as often as you like. The more, the better!

### Spellings

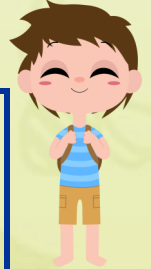
Practice reading the sounds or spellings that have been sent home.

You should practise spelling these words, but there will not be a test.

## Off on the trail...



You must complete three squares in a row, passing vertically, horizontally or diagonally through the middle square.



The Extra Mile...

Can you complete any 6 squares on the grid to get your Extra Mile sticker.

Design a pirate ship in your book.

Extra challenge: Can you make it? You could use any materials (junk modelling) or construction blocks (Lego, Duplo etc). The choice is yours.

Enjoy reading some pirate themed books with your loved ones. Can you discuss the differences between fiction and non-fiction?

Investigate materials that float and sink. Can you create a table to show your results.

Draw a treasure map.

Extra challenge: Can you write a set of directions to reach the treasure?

Design a wanted poster for a pirate! Include: Their name, a picture, what they did wrong, what they look like and a reward.

Design and make a pirate flag. Extra challenge: Can you make your flag symmetrical?

Create a pirate quiz. Can you ask your friends or family to see if they can answer any of the questions?

Draw a picture of a pirate and label it. Think about what they wear and what they carry.

Research a famous pirate and write a non-fiction fact file about them.
