Weekly homework tasks

Reading

Read or share a book at least five times a week. This could be your school reading book or a book from home.

Mathletics

Tasks will be set on Mathletics every other week. You can use the games and challenges available on Mathletics as often as you like. The more, the better! Practice the times tables facts that have been sent home.

Spellings

Practice the sounds or spellings that have been sent home.

Have a look at and learn the words list from your list and practice regularly.

Off on the trail...



You must complete three squares in a row, passing vertically, horizontally or diagonally through the middle square.

Create your own shape poem for the Great Fire of London. What shapes could you use?	Find out about money from 1666. What did the coins look like? How much did things cost?	Build a bridge to cross the River Thames. Is it steady enough to carry a toy car?
Draw, sketch or paint a picture of Samuel Pepys.	Pretend that you are witnessing the Great Fire of London and write a diary entry for each day that the fire blazed through the city.	Explore or draw a map of London, before and after the fire. How has it changed?
Create a survival guide for people living in 1666. What should you avoid? What are the dangers?	Design and make your own flipbook or picture animation based on the Great Fire of London. Remember 24 pictures = 1 second of film!	Create a list of questions to ask a fire fighter from 1666. What do you want to find out?
