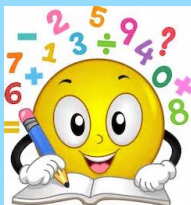

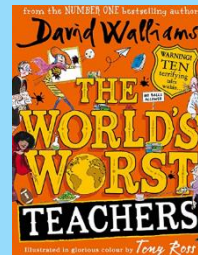
We are missing you all – it is just too quiet without you!
