Reading

You may have many of these stories at home to enjoy and read but you can also watch your teachers reading some of these classic tales by following the links of the Year 1 newsletter.

This could also be followed up by watching animated versions on YouTube, with the support of a parent to search for specific stories.

When you know some of the stories really well you could try acting them out for your family.

Don't forget to continue reading to an adult everyday where possible!

Task 2:

Can you write a letter from Goldilocks to Baby Bear apologising for eating his porridge, breaking his chair and sleeping in his bed!

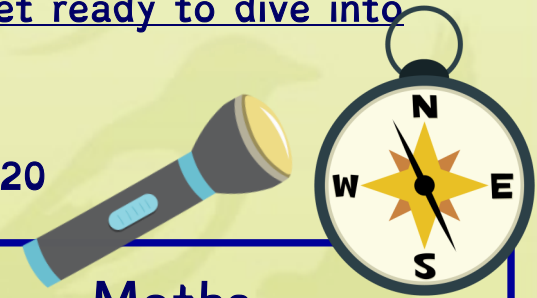
Don't forget to practise spelling your Year 1 high frequency words which can be found in your original home learning book (that was sent out at the beginning of the year).
