Complete the 3 in 1 activities on "The Emperor and his Adviser" and "The Wishing Tree"


## Writing

Practice your Year 2 spelling words.

Create an information page about the job you would like to do when you are an adult. What would you need to do each day?

Log into **Purple Mash** for your 2Do. Create a recipe for Latkes and honey cakes made to celebrate the Jewish festival of Chanukah.

Interview an adult in your house about their job— what skills and qualities make them successful? What would they like to be better at? Write your questions and the answers in your home learning book.



## Maths

Practise your times tables (2, 5, 10, 3 and beyond!) in any fun way you can.

Draw and name as many 2D shapes that you think of. Count the number of edges (sides) and the number of vertices (corners.)

Then use these shapes to make some interesting patterns in your home learning book.

Log into **Purple Mash** for your 2DO on shape. For a challenge, try the naming 2D shapes quiz.

Complete the set **Mathletics** activities— Spring, Geometry activities on 2d and 3d shapes and patterns.



## STAR skills– RE

Do some research using the internet or from books about Judaism– What do Jewish people believe in? What special celebrations do they have? Are there any special foods?

Find out what a mezuzah is– why are they used? Where are they placed? What is a dreidel used for and who by? Why is Shabbat important?

Log on the Purple Mash and complete your 2DO on creating a colourful picture of a Chanukiah.

## STAR skills– PSHCE

Money, money, money! Think about where money comes from. How do children get money? How do grown-ups get money? Make a mind-map in your home learning book.

Make a list of all of the jobs that you could do to earn money around the house. Make another list of all of the jobs that you could do as an adult.

What would you like to do when you grow up? Write a paragraph or two about your future job hopes and why you think that you would be good at it, including what qualities and skills that you think that you may need.

Draw or paint a picture of yourself in your future job.

Can you make your own mezuzah? What special words would you write to put inside it?
