Reading

Have a look for Fairy Tale stories in your home, The Three Little Pigs would be great, but if you don't have it choose another, its fine! Continue to challenge yourself to read at least once every day, and follow the same skills we asked in our first trail in your books. Share your reading with an adult at home and answer their questions about the storyline, the characters and the author's. where are the stories set? Can you see any patterns in the story line? Is there always a bad character? Talk about your favourite parts of the story. What didn't you like? See if you can tell your grown up what the events were that happened in the story. Can you find another version of the same fairy tale how is it different? Does it have a different ending? Can you think of your own version of the story and change a part?

Writing

1) Draw a picture of a character from a Fairy Tale you have read and label them to describe what they look like.

2) Write a sentence about an event that happens in a Fairy Tale story you have read in your home learning book. Tell your grown up the sentence you want to write. Think about the sounds you can hear. Can you write it down? Have you remembered your capital letters, finger space and full stops? Ask your grown up to draw the lines to enable you to write the sentences in your home learning book so you can write on them. Then draw a picture of the part of the story you have written about.

3) Continue to practice your letter formation. Can you write the capital and lower case letters for the alphabet. Use the sound mat we have sent home to use the sounds you can hear.

Maths

Mathletics challenges will be set as normal. 1) learn the song of ten green bottles.. Can you add one more or take one away?

2) Save some toilet roll tubes and make different shapes out of them, can you draw round them or use paint to make a pattern? What shapes can

you make?



3) Practice and recall number bonds to 10. Find ten small objects and find as many ways as you can to put them into two groups. You could use two bowls and 10 buttons.
