Reading and Talking

Week 1.

Read/[listen](#) to the story of Little red riding hood with your grown up. A copy of the story is found on this [document link](#) if you don't have a copy at home. When you have finished, talk about the story. Who were the characters in the story? Where was the story set? Can you remember what the sneaky wolf did? What did he say? What would you take with you if you were visiting a relative? Try the [Purple Mash](#) activity, painting the wolf and putting the words in order.



Week 2

Have a look at some family photographs. Have you got pictures of different places you have visited? Talk about where you went? Did you visit someone in your family like Little Red Riding Hood did? Who did you go with? What did you do there?



Writing: labels, captions and sentences

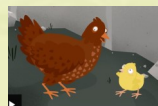
Creative Adventure

PSHE The Big Carrot

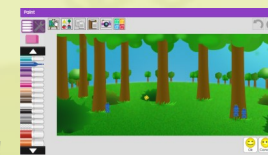
This story (click [here](#)) is always a favourite and is similar to 'The Enormous Turnip'. Talk about how working together is a good way to solve problems and form friendships.
