Reading

- Giving the meaning/definition of words used within the text.
- Drawing inferences from the text and relating to your own experiences.

Consolidate this learning in the home by :

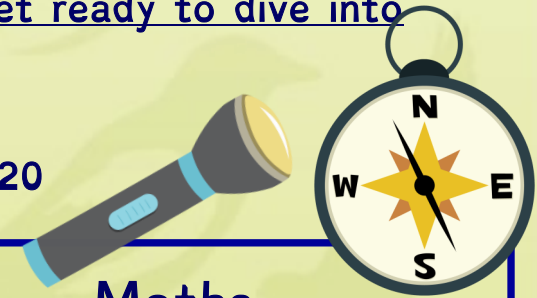
Talk about the order that you do things using the 'time vocabulary on the help sheet above.
