Weekly homework tasks

Reading

Read for at least 10 minutes every day. This could be your school reading book or a book from home.

Mathletics and Time Tables

Spellings

Practice the spellings that have been sent home, ready to be tested in school.

Have a look at and learn the high frequency words from the list from your year group on the school website; practice regularly. Off on the trail...



You must complete three squares in a row, passing vertically, horizontally or diagonally through the middle square.

Research and write an account of the journey made by a world river.

Look at the countries it passes through—where it starts and finishes.

Draw or paint a picture or scene from the Medieval times, e.g. village life, the royal court, a Medieval church service. Spend time with your family.

Write and take photos of a
journey you make together. This
could be a journey of any length
to any place.

Write a diary entry from a peasant child living in a village. Talk about life in the village how you spend your day, how you feel and any other specific things that you do.

Research and write an account about a famous explorer (past or present) and the journey they have made. Include a map of the route that they took.

Create a piece of 3-D artwork based on the theme of 'Journeys'.

Carry out a science or technology experiment looking at movement or change.
