Reading

Make sure that you read today for at least 20 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult.

Times Tables

Spend at least 20 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on the ones you are working on in class.

Spelling

Spend 20 minutes practising the words from your spelling list.



Maths

We will be continuing our unit of work on place value and looking at how we round six digit numbers to the nearest 1,000, 10,000 and 100,000. Watch the White Rose video clip by clicking on the link on the grid. This will explain things in more detail. We have also put a short Powerpoint together which you will find on the grid too to give you some further support. When you have looked at these, complete the questions on the task sheet. You will find this on the grid too. The questions get progressively more challenging as you work through them. If you get stuck, look at the video or Powerpoint again to help you out.

Learning Adventure

Task 1– Have a look at the information sheet about medieval farms. This will give you some information and key facts about this aspect of medieval life. You will find this on the grid. Today you are going to produce a piece of writing in the first person, describing what your life as a medieval farmer is like.
