Below you will find your daily learning tasks for you to complete at home. Try to complete them each day so that you can keep on top of your work. Your teachers will give you feedback to show you how you are doing, some of this will be on the website. Your parents will also need to email your teachers with photos of your work so that they can reply and give you some personalised feedback. Make sure you let your teachers know if there is anything that you need help with.

Reading

Make sure that you read today for at least 20 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult.

Times Tables

Spend at least 20 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on those you are working on in class.

Spelling

Spend 20 minutes practising the words from your spelling list.



Maths

Today our maths lesson focus' on efficient subtraction. You will look at different calculations and explore which subtraction method would be most efficient and why. Please watch the helpful video link posted below in our year 4 area. This link will talk you through the methods and question styles you will be working on today. You can then work through our maths input slides before beginning your task.

English

This week we are looking at using direct speech. Direct speech includes many punctuation markers which must be accurate. Today you will be the teacher by spotting and correcting punctuation errors in direct speech. There is a short video below which you should watch to support your learning.

Guided Reading

This week we are continuing to follow Daisy and her rainforest adventure. Read through the initial slides before reading the text. There is an example of answering in FULL sentences, using the question within your answer. The first questions are for you to simply think about as you read and do not need to be written down. The questions for you to answer in your book are at the END of the slides.

Geography

Geography this week focuses on what countries make up the UK. You will explore the difference between great Britain, the United Kingdom and the British isles.
