Below you will find your daily learning tasks for you to complete at home. Try to complete them each day so that you can keep on top of your work. Your teachers will give you feedback to show you how you are doing, some of this will be on the website. Your parents will also need to email your teachers with photos of your work so that they can reply and give you some personalised feedback. Make sure you let your teachers know if there is anything that you need help with.



Reading

Make sure that you read today for at least 20 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult.

Times Tables

Spend at least 20 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on those you are working on in class.

Spelling

Spend 20 minutes practising the words from your spelling list.

Maths

Today our maths lesson focuses on estimation. Estimation is an important skill within maths to help us check our answers or make sensible guesses. Then complete your choice of worksheet based on your confidence.

English

This lesson looks more deeply at direct speech. You will recap specific and accurate punctuation needed for direct speech. We will look at how speech is shown as a speech bubble and convert this to direct speech. Don't forget to watch the video posted below to support your learning.

Guided Reading

This week we are continuing to follow Daisy and her rainforest adventure. Read through the initial slides before reading the text. There is an example of answering in **FULL** sentences, using the question within your answer. The first questions are for you to simply think about as you read and do not need to be written down. The questions for you to answer in your book are at the **END** of the slides.

GPS

This is a recap lesson of using apostrophes for contractions. You will have covered this in previous years as well as in year 4, so you should be becoming more confident with this. It is important that you understand why apostrophes are needed and how they are used accurately so that it becomes natural to use them within your extended writing. We will be looking for accurate use in all writing lessons across different subjects. You may choose your worksheet based on your confidence with using apostrophes for contractions.
