Even though we can't be at school at the moment, it is still important for you to continue with your learning at home so that we don't miss out on learning opportunities.

Below you will find your daily learning tasks for you to complete at home. Try to complete them each day so that you can keep on top of your work. Your teachers will give you feedback to show you how you are doing, some of this will be on the website. Your parents will also need to email your teachers with photos of your work so that they can reply and give you some personalised feedback. Make sure you let your teachers know if there is anything that you need help with.

Reading

Make sure that you read today for at least 20 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult.

Times Tables

Spend at least 20 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on those you are working on in class.

Spelling

Spend 20 minutes practising the words from your spelling list.



Maths

Maths today continues to focus on estimation. We will use a similar format from during the week, looking at "diving" into mastery questions. The deeper you dive, the more complex the questions become. You can choose to complete one or more of these sets of questions. Some slides have some questions for you to try, with the answers covered. The answers will be shown on the following slides. I have had to do this slightly differently as I cannot uncover them for you as we go along as I usually would!

English

Today you will be using what you have learnt throughout the week in creating your own written conversations. You must focus on using the correct punctuation. Your help slides will also give you hints and tips on what you should include! Remember you can also refer back to any of our help slides from during the week or the videos posted.

Spelling

Today you will be looking at "ture" words. You will use the given ture words to practice your handwriting, focusing on spelling and consistent letter formation. Then unscramble the letters and complete the given sentences with appropriate ture words. There is also a dictation activity to complete. Remember these need to be read to you by an adult or sibling. You should write the sentence using the correct punctuation and spellings—and of course they all include "ture" words!

Art

This week's are focuses on colour. You will look at the colours used within David Hockney's art work and how these differ from others. You will recap the primary colours and how they can be used to create new colours. There are a range of activities for you to complete depending on your resources at home. If you are unable to complete any of these, then work through the helpful slides and answer the questions in your unexpected adventure book.
