Even though we can't be at school at the moment, it is still important for you to continue with your learning at home so that we don't miss out on learning opportunities.

Below you will find your daily learning tasks for you to complete at home. Try to complete them each day so that you can keep on top of your work. Your teachers will give you feedback to show you how you are doing, some of this will be on the website. Your parents will also need to email your teachers with photos of your work so that they can reply and give you some personalised feedback. Make sure you let your teachers know if there is anything that you need help with.

Reading

Make sure that you read today for at least 20 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult.

Times Tables

Spend at least 20 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on those you are working on in class.

Spelling

Spend 20 minutes practising the words from your spelling list.

Maths

Today we are moving onto our new topic of multiplication and division! Usually we would start with a "ready to progress" assessments, but unfortunately we cannot do these at home. The more you practice your times tables in the coming weeks, the easier you will find this new block of work. Today we are focusing on multiplying numbers by ten and therefore making numbers ten times bigger. Work through the lesson slides and complete the introductions tasks as you go, then work on the questions from your worksheet within your book.

English— GPS

We have been learning about using apostrophes accurately to show possession (something belongs) and for contractions. Today you are going to practice identifying misconceptions and practice spotting when an apostrophe has been used incorrectly. There are a few tasks for you to choose from, depending on how confident you feel, but remember to challenge yourself!

Guided Reading

This week we are beginning to look at our new class book—Charlotte's Web. A PDF version of the book will be available on the website for you to follow. For guided reading, we will always specify which pages you will need to read and focus on, so ensure you check your slides for this information. As always, do not write the question out in your book, use the question to help you phrase your answer.

Learning Adventure (Science)

Within science today you will be looking at categorising animals as vertebrates and invertebrates. Work through the lesson slides to ensure you are able to explain these scientific terms, then complete your task in your unexpected adventure book.
