

Kingfishers' and Nightingales' Unexpected Adventure Trail

Even though we can't be at school at the moment, it is still important for you to continue with your learning at home so that we don't miss out on learning opportunities.

Below you will find your daily learning tasks for you to complete at home. Try to complete them each day so that you can keep on top of your work. Your teachers will give you feedback to show you how you are doing, some of this will be on the website. Your parents will also need to email your teachers with photos of your work so that they can reply and give you some personalised feedback. Make sure you let your teachers know if there is anything that you need help with.

Reading

Make sure that you read today for at least 20 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult.

Times Tables

Spend at least 20 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on those you are working on in class.

Spelling

Spend 20 minutes practising the words from your spelling list.



Maths

Today you are looking at multiplying numbers by 100, therefore making number 100 times bigger. This lesson uses similar skills from yesterday's lesson, so you should be feeling confident!

Remember, multiplying by 100 is not simply adding two 0's. You must work through the slides to ensure you understand why the number gains these 0's and how the number has changed.

English

Over the next few weeks we will be writing our own stories which include a problem and dilemma. We will be writing this slowly across several lessons to help us focus on specific writing skills, so it is important to remember not to rush ahead. Lesson 1 today will focus on planning your story, using a story mountain, similar to the one we used last term so this should be familiar to you. Work through the slide before beginning your task.

Guided Reading

Today you will need to reread pages 1 and 2, then progress to reading pages 3, 4 and 5. Today you will focus on inference skills. Inferencing requires the reader to read between the lines, so the information may not be directly written in the text. Read through both the pages and lesson slides before answering your questions. You will need to use evidence from the text within your answers.

Spelling

Whilst you are learning at home, it is important to keep practicing your spellings. Today we are going to recap the different methods you can use to independently practice your weekly spellings. Watch Miss Brooker's short video to recap these methods, then spend 15-20 minutes revising your coloured spelling list. If you feel confident with your current spelling list, you could also begin practicing the next list.
