Below you will find your daily learning tasks for you to complete at home. Try to complete them each day so that you can keep on top of your work. Your teachers will give you feedback to show you how you are doing, some of this will be on the website. Your parents will also need to email your teachers with photos of your work so that they can reply and give you some personalised feedback. Make sure you let your teachers know if there is anything that you need help with.



Reading

Make sure that you read today for at least 15 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult.

Times Tables

Spend at least 15 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on the 2, 5 and 10 x tables.

Spelling

Spend 15 minutes practising the words from the spelling list at the front of your homework book.

PE

You have an extra optional activity today. Log onto imoves using the details sent out via parentmail.

Maths

Today's maths is all about writing multiplication sentences using pictures. Look carefully at the pictures to see how many groups there are and how many are in each group. The stem sentences will be very helpful as we work through this unit, remember we use the x symbol to represent "groups of" or "lots of" . If you get stuck— make it with whatever you have at home!

This will explain things in more detail. When you have watched this, complete the questions in your *Unexpected Adventure* books You will find this on the pdf document too. The questions get progressively more challenging as you work through them. If you get stuck, look at the video again to help you out. Don't forget to complete your *Mathletics* tasks too!

Learning Adventure

Task 1— We are continuing our story by using the words collected to write the next part. Use the example to help if you are unsure, or listen to the audio again.

Task 2— We are going to continue looking at contractions and those shortened words. Don't forget to put the apostrophe in place of the missing letters.
