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Maths

The next step in multiplication is to look at arrays. This is a way of showing a multiplication in a columns and rows. This is useful because it helps us to understand the commutative law- that multiplication can be done in any order (like addition) eg 5 x 8 is the same as 8 x 5 as the array can be turned around. It helps when we may not know some of our tables for example the 8x table but we know our 5x table. Watch the White Rose video clip by clicking on the link on the pdf document. This will explain things in more detail. When you have watched this, complete the questions in your Unexpected Adventure books You will find this on the pdf document too. The questions get progressively more challenging as you work through them. If you get stuck, look at the video again to help you out. Don't forget to complete your Mathletics tasks too!
