Work through the teaching slides and complete each of the practice questions. Look carefully at the different methods that have been used to solve the problems as these will be similar to the methods that you will need to use to complete your independent work.

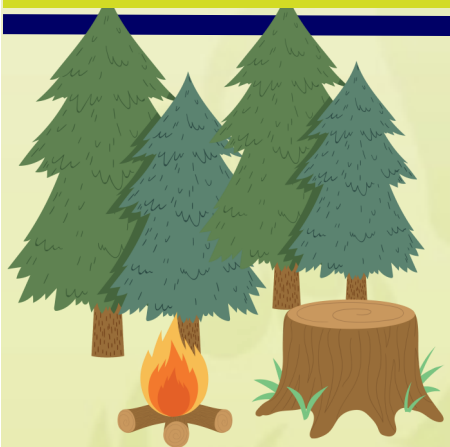

Creative Adventure

Last week you all created a brilliant motif—you may wish to take another look at yours as we will be using them in today's lesson.

Read through the teaching slides and have a look at the ways in which we can create a pattern. See if you can spot the different types of pattern that we have explored in prints by William Morris.

We would then like you to add to your motif—this could just be a few extra details—then have a go at repeating this. Look carefully at the example we have included on the teaching slides to see how the pattern has been repeated in each square.
