Even though we can't be at school at the moment, it is still important for you to continue with your learning at home so that we don't miss out on learning opportunities.

Below you will find your daily learning tasks for you to complete at home. Try to complete them each day so that you can keep on top of your work. Your teachers will give you feedback to show you how you are doing, some of this will be on the website. Your parents will also need to email your teachers with photos of your work so that they can reply and give you some personalised feedback. Make sure you let your teachers know if there is anything that you need help with.

Reading

Make sure that you read today for at least 20 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult.

Times Tables

Spend at least 20 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on those you are working on in class.

Spelling

Spend 20 minutes practising the words from your spelling list.



Maths

Today you will look at dividing numbers by 100, therefore making the numbers 100 x smaller. Think about the skills and methods we looked at yesterday in our zoom together and consider how you could use these to support you today. Work through the slides and complete your choice of questions based on your confidence. Miss Brooker is hosting a live zoom tomorrow to discuss any tricky maths work, so if you have any particular question that you cannot complete, don't worry—we can look at this together tomorrow.

English

Today you are going to write the middle of your story, your problem and dilemma! Try not to over complicate your story and make sure it is clear to your reader what your problem is and the two choices they are torn between. Make sure you listen to Miss King's audio recording of the lesson input before you begin your writing task.

Guided Reading

Today in guided reading, you will need to read chapter 1 and continue onto page 7. We are continuing to work hard to write our answers in full sentences, so double check your answer once you have written it. Would I know the question from looking at your answer? One of today's questions asks you to "find and copy" a phrase, this means this phrase **MUST** be spelt correctly, or it would not be marked as correct.

GPS

Today you will look at pronouns. You will be able to identify which words are pronouns and when and how they are used. You will look at the difference between a noun and pronoun. Work through the lesson slides and watch the link attached below. When drawing out a table in your book for your task, ensure you use a ruler if possible and keep your work clear.
