

Reading Comprehension Guide

Each piece of text will have questions to answer. Questions will be different types and will be categorised as below. These will need to be talked through with the children. Each question will be 'labelled' with a different animal picture.

Sequence Questions with Sequencing Suki

Sequencing Suki likes everything in order! She will help you sequence the events in a text.



Vocabulary Questions with Vocabulary Victor

Vocabulary Victor will help you to look at how authors and poets have chosen to use certain words and phrases.

Retrieval Questions with Rex Retriever

Rex Retriever will help you to go into a text and retrieve the facts.



Inference Questions with Inference Iggy

Inference Iggy will help you hunt for clues in a text about how someone might be feeling or why something is happening.

Prediction Questions with Predicting Pip

Predicting Pip tries to see the future and she will help you work out what might happen next.

Recipe for a Healthy Fruit Salad

You will need:

- one juicy, red apple
- three plump strawberries
- a handful of grapes
- one ripe banana
- any other fruit that you enjoy eating
- one cup of fresh, sweet orange juice
- a large, plastic bowl
- a sharp knife for an adult to use
- a spoon

What to do:

1) Before you start, make sure that you wash your hands.

- 2) With help from a grown-up, cut up your fruit into small pieces.
- 3) Put the little chunks of fruit into a bowl.
- 4) Pour the orange juice over the fruit until it is all covered.
- 5) Mix the fruit salad and enjoy!
