Try to complete your tasks each day so that you can keep on top of your work. Your daily reading and phonics are top priority. We have numbered the tasks in priority order for those parents that have asked us to do this. Your parents will also need to email your teachers with photos of your work so that they can reply and give you some personalised feedback.

2. Reading

Please continue to make sure that you read everyday for 10 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult or to your teddies. Remember to watch Storytime with Miss Pile. How many animals can you spot?

2. Science

We are finding out all about the diet of the animal we have been learning about. Are they carnivores, herbivores or omnivores?

1. Phonics

This week we are recapping phase 5 sounds. Please spend a few minutes practising your Phase 2 and 3 sounds everyday from your sound mats, in your homework books or with Mrs Clark's video below the grid. Our sound of the day is the split digraph 'ea'. Use the support sheet on the grid to do your phonics today.

4. Maths

Today we are looking at subtraction by comparing numbers and finding the difference. Watch Mrs Jones's video first so you can work through the new learning before you do your questions. Your question sheet is also on the grid, you can print it out or just write the answers in your book, see if you can do the challenge too!
