

# Magpies and Cuckoos' Feedback

Make sure that you try to keep up with the tasks that you have been set each day. That way, when we return to school, you will feel more confident about where we are up to.

The feedback here describes what the class did well and how we can make our work even better.

## Maths

Lots of you made a great start to the problem solving questions today – we know that this is tricky but it does get easier the more you practice. It is a good idea to use bar models to help you with these questions so that might be something to consider using next time if you found it tricky today.

Use the answers on the next page to mark your work and make any corrections. If you are unsure as to where you went wrong, send your work to your teacher for feedback.

## Learning Adventure

You all gave Jim some fantastic advice– what a tricky decision he has to make! We know that you all have your own personal idea as to what you think Jim should do, but make sure that your work is balanced. It should include reasons why he shouldn't try to escape and reasons why he should. You have all carefully considered the potential risks and dangers facing Jim and lots of you have used scenes or facts from the book to help you. What would you do if you were in that situation? Would you behave in the same way as Jim or differently?

## Spelling

You all had a great go at this. We will be continuing to look at these words next week so you may wish to add them to the spelling words that you practice each day.

1. a)  $602 \div 3 = 200 \text{ r } 2$

b)  $3,862 \div 8 = 482 \text{ r } 6$

2.  $365 \div 7 = 52 \text{ r } 1$

Max is incorrect as there are 52 weeks and one extra day each year.

3. a)  $5 \times 32 + 3 = 163$

163 stickers were shared out altogether.

b)  $163 \div 6 = 27 \text{ r } 1$

Each child gets 27 stickers. There is 1 sticker left over.

4.  $(2,050 - 187) \div 9 = 207$

One box is 207 mm wide.

5.  $6 \times 416 = 2,496$

$5,000 - 2,496 = 2,504$

$2,504 \div 8 = 313$

There is 313 ml of water in each short glass.

If you have the wrong answer and cannot spot your mistake, ask an adult to email your work to your teacher and they will be able to help you out.
