Below you will find your daily learning tasks for you to complete at home. Try to complete them each day so that you can keep on top of your work. Your teachers will give you feedback to show you how you are doing, some of this will be on the website. Your parents will also need to email your teachers with photos of your work so that they can reply and give you some personalised feedback. Make sure you let your teachers know if there is anything that you need help with.

Reading

Make sure that you read today for at least 20 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult.

Times Tables

Spend at least 20 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on those you are working on in class.

Spelling

Spend 20 minutes practising the words from your spelling list.



Maths

Today you are looking at multiplying by 1 and 0. This may seem like a simple task, but it is an important skill to recap and understand. Read through your questions carefully and ensure you understand it before answering.

English

Today in English you are going to write the resolution part of your story. This is where your character makes their choice, which must be one of the two choices you set out earlier in your story. Listen carefully to Miss King's lesson input and work through the slides with her, then take a minimum of 30 minutes to really focus on your story and get your ideas down. Read your initial story before beginning today's resolution and read through again once you have completed your work.

Spelling

Today in spelling, you will be looking at homophones. You will be exploring there, their and they're as well as to, too and two. These words come up a lot in our written work, so it is important to remember which spelling is required. Homophones can be tricky to remember, so the more we practice, the more confident we will become!

Art

This week we are continuing to explore the work of David Hockney. We are going to follow a video link to explore various pencil techniques and how these can be used to help our sketches. You are going to sketch a landscape picture, either of a Godinton school photo or your own garden or local park. This would be a lovely lesson to complete outdoors in order to sketch the landscape around you accurately, but this may depend on the weather!
