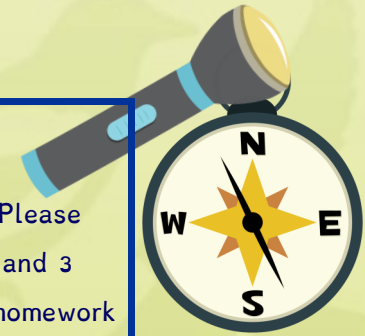


# Foxes and Otters' Unexpected Adventure Trail

We have numbered the tasks in priority order for those parents that have asked us to do this. ## 2. Reading

Please continue to make sure that you read everyday for 10 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult or to your teddies. Remember to watch Storytime with Miss Pile. How many animals can you spot?

## 5. Don't Hog the Hedge comprehension

Ask a member of your family to share the story with you and see if you can answer the questions as you read through each page.

## 1. Phonics

This week we are recapping phase 5 sounds. Please spend a few minutes practising your Phase 2 and 3 sounds everyday from your sound mats, in your homework books or with Mrs Clark's video below the grid. Our sound of the day is the split digraph 'oy'. Use the support sheet on the grid to do your phonics today.

## 4. Maths

Today we are bringing all your hard work on addition and subtraction together. Watch Mrs Jones's video first so you can find out what your task is, remember you can use your ten frames, number lines or objects from around your house to help you. Your question sheet is on the grid, you can print it out or just write your equations in your book, see if you can do the challenge too!

## 3. Learning Adventure
