Maths

We have seen lots of excellent decimal work and problem solving this week, well done everyone! A couple of feedback points:

- Make sure that you read the question carefully to be clear about what you have been asked. If you are asked to show your answers to or round to one decimal place, you need to do that.
- Rounding works exactly the same way with decimals as with whole numbers. Look at the place value column to the right of the one you have to round to. 0 to 4 = round down. 5 to 9 = round up.

Remember: mistakes are how we learn!

Grammar/Spelling/Reading

Grammar— writing in passive voice, the use of colons and formal language are all features that you will need to use when you write your biography next week. We will talk about how to include them in our live lesson next Wednesday.

Spelling—here has been a lot of super spelling work this week. Make sure you use the words from the lessons in your biography. Reading—remember to always answer in full sentences and use the

PEE technique to help you answer fully.
