Reading

Times Tables

Spend at least 15 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on the 2, 5 and 10 x tables.

Spelling

Spend 15 minutes practising the words from the spelling list at the front of your homework book.

Maths

For maths today we will be continuing by looking at the 10x table. Remember this is just groups of 10, as before if you are stuck use whatever you have around you at home to make the groups of 10 so you can work the answers out. There is a challenge at the end if you are feeling confident— the answer for this is on a separate pdf. Watch the White Rose video clip by clicking on the link on the pdf document. This will explain things in more detail. When you have watched this, complete the questions in your Unexpected Adventure books You will find this on the pdf document too. The questions get progressively more challenging as you work through them. If you get stuck, look at the video again to help you out. Don't forget to complete your Mathletics tasks too!

Learning Adventure

Task 1— This week you have creative activities for your Learning Adventure, beginning with Music. Listen to the first of our music lesson audio files and journey back to London in 1666. Learn a new song, listen to some 17th century instruments and perform some clapping and action rhythms.
