Below you will find your daily learning tasks for you to complete at home. Try to complete them each day so that you can keep on top of your work. Your teachers will give you feedback to show you how you are doing, some of this will be on the website. Your parents will also need to email your teachers with photos of your work so that they can reply and give you some personalised feedback. Make sure you let your teachers know if there is anything that you need help with.



Reading

Make sure that you read today for at least 15 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult.

Times Tables

Spend at least 15 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on the 2, 5 and 10 x tables.

Spelling

Spend 15 minutes practising the words from the spelling list at the front of your homework book.

PE

You have an extra optional activity today. Log onto imoves using the details sent out via parentmail.

Maths

We will be finishing our multiplication by looking at word problems using the 2, 5 and 10x tables. Use your stem sentences for support when you try and work out groupings, remember the x symbol means "groups of". Remember that you can always use whatever you have at home to make the groups to help you too. There is a challenge question at the end if you are feeling confident, the answers are on a separate pdf. Watch the White Rose video clip by clicking on the link on the pdf document. This will explain things in more detail. When you have watched this, complete the questions in your Unexpected Adventure books You will find this on the pdf document too. The questions get progressively more challenging as you work through them. If you get stuck, look at the video again to help you out. Don't forget to complete your Mathletics tasks too!

Learning Adventure

Task 1— Listen to the second of our music audio files and some more of Samuel Pepys diary. Today you will use body percussion and mouth sounds to make a sound picture for the Great Fire of London. If you have instruments at home or something you can tap then use it for this lesson to create a repeating drum rhythm or create accompanying sounds. Sing along to an adapted version of London's Burning, all about fighting the fire in the 17th Century.
