Below you will find your daily learning tasks for you to complete at home. Try to complete them each day so that you can keep on top of your work. Your teachers will give you feedback to show you how you are doing, some of this will be on the website. Your parents will also need to email your teachers with photos of your work so that they can reply and give you some personalised feedback. Make sure you let your teachers know if there is anything that you need help with.

Reading

Make sure that you read today for at least 20 minutes. This could be by yourself or to an adult.

Times Tables

Spend at least 20 minutes practising your times tables. Focus on the ones you are working on in class.

Spelling

Spend 20 minutes practising the words from your spelling list.



Maths

Well done for completing your Ready to Progress Assessment yesterday. Hopefully this has given you a little reminder of what to expect when we look at fractions. Miss Attenborough has uploaded a video explaining how your maths lessons will be working for this unit so please watch this before you start your tasks today.

When you are ready, watch the White Rose Maths video "What is a fraction?". Take a look at the teaching slides to complete some practice problems and choose which level of challenge you would like to start on today. If you manage to complete all of the questions, you may move onto the reasoning and problem solving challenges. Check through your work carefully when the answers are uploaded on your feedback sheet.

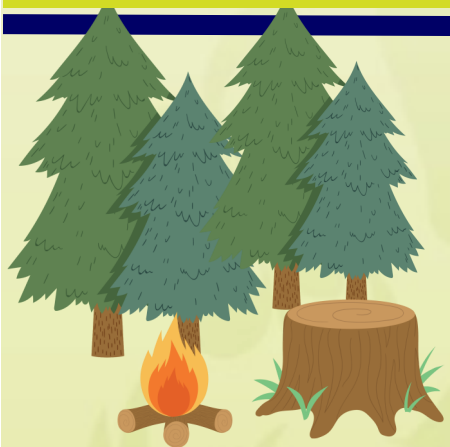
Learning Adventure

Today you will be writing a diary entry from the perspective of Rosie. Begin today's lesson by watching the video that Miss Attenborough has created, explaining your tasks for today and how to go about planning your diary entry. You will need to pause the video a few times.

When you are ready, write up your diary entry which will tell us what happened after Emily and Lizzie were left with Rosie. We have uploaded some writing mats to help you with this. Remember you can also take words and phrases from the example diary entry that we uploaded.

Once you have finished, it is important that you read through your diary entry carefully. Make sure that your spelling and punctuation is accurate and you have included each of the bronze features.

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Maths Too

These week we will be revising some more of our learning from last term. Today we would like you to look at multiples. This is also a great opportunity for you to practice your times tables.

Take a look at the teaching slides for today and watch this [BBC Bitesize](#) video to remind you of what multiples are. You will also need to work through the PowerPoint that we have uploaded that takes you through some practice questions. It is a good idea for you to have a pencil and paper ready to help you work these out.

When you are ready, choose your level of challenge and complete as many questions as you can in 20 minutes.
