Reading

Guided Reading

Create your own blurb of the story we have been reading: Into the Forest. Look at the examples on the input and have a go at writing your own. Remember not to give too much of the story away! The real blurb will be revealed later.

Learning Adventure

Opening Paragraph-

Today we are going to turn the first box of our plan into a full paragraph. We are going to introduce the protagonist (Corky) describe him, what is he going to do? What is he thinking/feeling about his day? Then describe the first setting—Lizard street. Use senses to describe what he can see/smell/feel/hear as he walks down the street. Use the setting word mat to support you. Then use adverbs to describe how he descends into the sewer. There is an example paragraph on the lesson input to give you some ideas.
