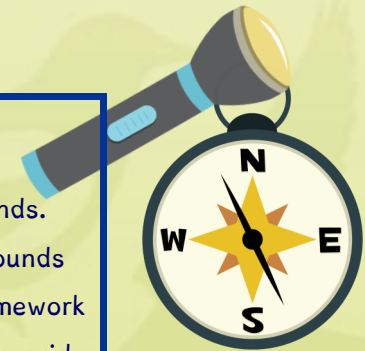


# Foxes and Otters' Unexpected Adventure Trail

## 4. Maths

Join Mrs Jones on video to learn about your length and height maths task today. We are going to be using standard units to measure objects accurately. Your question sheet is on the grid, you can print it out or just write your answers in your book, see if you can do the challenge too!
