Phonics



Thank you so much to all of you who attended the Year R to 2 Phonics and Reading Information Evening before we broke for Half Term — it was lovely to see such a supportive turn out. For those of you who were unable to make the meeting, your child will have brought home a phonics information pack which gives you lots of information about our new phonics scheme and the ways in which you can support your child at home with their phonics.

Your information pack, included information about the free library of Monster Phonics eBooks which will help to support your child's phonics knowledge. Each week, the teachers will be informing you as to which eBooks to read at home, this information will be put into the children's reading record book. The eBooks can be accessed on a tablet, smartphone or laptop; if anyone doesn't have access to technology at home, please get in touch. We would encourage parents to look at the eBooks books during the day rather than at bedtime.

These eBooks support the guided reading sessions that your child will be engaging with in school and different children will be looking at different books. Please remember that your child will also have their colour coded reading books which they should also be reading regularly at home.

Sports Report

We are very much looking forward to being able to compete against other schools again from this term onwards. This week and next week pupils from years 3 to 6 will be competing in a virtual cross country event – where they will run either 800m or 1600m on our school field. The top 5 times for boys and girls in each age group will be submitted and compared against other schools and medals awarded for the top 3 in each category. There will also be 3 additional medals for children in our school who demonstrate the school sports values: determination, passion, respect, self-belief, teamwork and honesty.

We also have some other exciting sporting events to look forward to. Year 4 will be competing in a Multi-Skills competition against other local schools which will see them putting a variety of sporting skills to good use. In January children from years 3-6 will compete in Sporthall Athletics events at the Stour Centre—this will include a mix of track and field events such as hurdles, soft javelin, speed bounce and standing long jump.
