### Mathletics and Times Tables

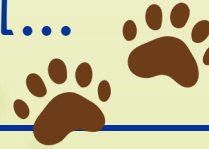

<p>Create a non-chronological report about a class hero; Malala Yousafzai. Include non-chronological features you have learnt including formal and technical language and subheadings. You may present your work in any way you choose. You could show off your computing skills.</p>	<p>Imagine that you have travelled to a far away land, on the hunt for a new species. Write a story documenting your journey through this far away land and the problems you encounter trying to find your new discovery. Don't forget your fronted adverbials.</p>	<p>This term we will be creating self portraits. Link last term's learning of Juan Miro with this term by creating a self portrait print using materials that add depth and texture when printing with paint.</p>
<p>Write a set of instructions about how to make a chocolate bar. Remember to use fronted adverbials, imperative verbs, subordinate conjunctions and time adverbs. You can present this in any way that you would like—even as a recipe book.</p>	<p>Over the last two terms, we have looked in depth at sustainability and deforestation in the Amazon Rainforest. Create a poster or write a speech about your plan to help save the rainforest.</p>	<p>Create a cartoon comic strip. Your short story can be a theme of your choice. It must include speech bubbles for dialogue. Once finished, turn your speech bubble into direct speech with accurate punctuation markers including inverted commas.</p>
