Long Term Overview

Three art units are taught across an academic year as part of our 'Creative Adventure'. Where there is no art coverage during a particular term, the creative adventure focus will be on Design Technology. Each art focus repeats three times, between Year 1 and Year 6 in order to progress and reinforce skills. In EYFS, Art takes place both in teacher-directed sessions, where specific art skills are explicitly taught, and during child-initiated learning, where children have the opportunity to explore and build upon their artistic skills through play. Activities may vary in EYFS depending on children's interests. Further opportunities for art are built into the school year through stand-alone projects such as Creative Arts Days.

To understand simple mono print techniques.</p> <p>Painting – colour mixing shades of colour. Application of paint to create colour washes and backgrounds.</p>	<p>3D sculpture – using unwanted materials to make a structure. Exploring techniques for joining e.g. sellotape and glue.</p>	<p>DT covered instead this term as part of our ‘Creative Adventure’.</p>
<p>Year 3</p>	<p>3D sculpture – using clay to create an item of pottery.</p>	<p>DT covered instead this term as part of our ‘Creative Adventure’.</p>	<p>Collage – exploring mosaics and how they are created.</p> <p>Painting – Colour and brush techniques to create a landscape scene. Adding detail using different sized brushes.</p>
<p>Year 4</p>	<p>Printing – To use a wider variety of materials to print a non repetitive design. Creating shapes and simple images from materials such as clingfilm, bubble wrap, string and polystyrene strips.</p>	<p>Drawing – revision of portraits and exploring figure drawing.</p>	<p>Textiles – creating a 3D item from a template. Developing simple stitching skills.</p>

<p>Year 5</p>	<p>Printing – To know how to create a detailed mono print to produce a pattern involving repeated, reflected or rotated motifs. To know how to create a relief print from a lino block and the techniques involved in creating this.</p>	<p>Collage – using a wide range of mixed media to convey a theme (fabric, paper, paint, digital images etc.)</p>	<p>Drawing and Painting – landscape sketching and painting. Exploring perspective and use of colour.</p>
<p>Year 6</p>	<p>Painting – sketching and painting buildings and structures. Exploring perspective and use of colour and texture.</p>	<p>3D sculpture – creating a piece of headwear from an original design template.</p>	<p>Textile – Creating an applique using a wide range of stitching and incorporating a variety of textiles.</p>
