## Fun on 2 wheels

This week has seen our Lower School children whizzing around on 2 wheels and practising their cycling skills! Our Year R children completed 'Balance Bike' sessions a few weeks ago and this week the instructors returned this week to develop their skills further with Cycle Ready sessions. Cycle Ready sessions look to move children from Balance Bikes (no pedals) straight on to pedal bikes. Foxes and Otters took their bikes on Thursday and Friday. For some children this was a chance to practise balance bike skills and then move on to the pedal bikes. For those children who are already cycling on two wheels without the use of stabilisers, they were given the opportunity to enhance their skills further and grow in confidence. Our instructors have been very impressed with the balance and cycling skills demonstrated by our Year R and 1 children over the past few weeks.





After Easter, Year 5 children begin their Bikeability sessions. These sessions practise signalling and manoeuvring on the school playground before putting the skills into practise on local estate roads. We also have Year 6 Cycle Confidence Days booked in for week commencing 22nd May. The Year 6 sessions allow the children to enhance cycling skills further and see them cycle routes that some of them need for Secondary School. In past years, groups have cycled to Ashford Station, Stour Centre and the Designer Outlet. On these sessions, the children can cycle approximately 5 -6 miles on their 90 minute cycle session. Look out for the letter after Easter!



## Coronation Celebrations

We are in the process of planning a day of celebrations for the King's Coronation on Friday 5th May. We are looking at ensuring that we mark this special occasion with lots of activities for the children to join in with.

The Coronation Ceremony for His Majesty King Charles III will take place on Saturday 6th May 2023 at Westminster Abbey. The Coronation will see people across the UK and the Commonwealth coming together to celebrate this historic day.

Here in Ashford the day will be celebrated with a community event in Victoria Park. This will include a live screening of the Coronation, and will be followed by 'The Coronation Procession' which will include performances from local groups and individuals.

A church service in honour of the newly crowned King Charles III will take place at St Mary the Virgin Church, Ashford, on the morning of Sunday 7th May.

## Governor Profile

### Mr King (Chair of Governors)



Steve first became a governor at the school in December 2000 and has been Chair of Governors since May 2005. He is a Member Appointed Governor and has

provided the following detail about himself:

I retired in 2018 having completed 40 years in the civil service, most recently working for the Home Office as a budget manager. I was keen to become a governor at Godinton to enable me to put my skills to good use to support the school in recognition for all they were doing for my children. By 2005 my children had left the school but its continued advances made me want to stay and share in its future successes. My experience in financial management, property management and health & safety assist me in my governor role and in leading the schools team of Governors. As Chair of Governors my main role is to chair meetings of the Governing Board and act as main point of contact with the headteacher. I also have joint lead responsibility for finance and I share the other responsibilities of the Governor role with my fellow Governors. I am married with two grown up children and I have lived on the Godinton Park estate since 1988. My spare time activities include gardening, woodworking and, due to advancing years, long naps in front of the television.

# Message from Mr King

Last month we held a Governor Training Day in school which enabled the Governors to learn about new developments and school processes as well as providing an opportunity to meet with some children to look at and discuss their books with them.

The day began with looking at the work undertaken to develop the curriculum. We learned that 10 Guiding Stars (Risk Taking, Motivation, Personal Best, Problem Solving, Independence, Perseverance, Self-confidence, Teamwork. Creative Thinking Communication), which are linked to our school values, provide the golden thread in the curriculum with each subject being linked to a Guiding Star. The Guiding Stars are the key life skills that we want our children to use in order to be successful in their learning. They look at developing the children's abilities to work with others, achieve their personal best and to aim high in all areas. The Guiding Stars are designed to encourage our children to be active learners and to develop resilience if they should find anything tricky. We looked at the information about the curriculum on the school website which, although still being developed, provides a good insight into the children's learning. You can find the information under the 'Curriculum' tab in the 'Menu', including a curriculum overview and details the learning adventures for each subject.

As well as looking at the reading curriculum and attendance, we also had the opportunity to talk to the children about their learning. Children from all year groups were keen to present their books and explain their content. All appeared very happy in school and were very positive about their learning.
