## Religious Education End Points

	End point:
Year 1	<ul> <li>I can identify what and how people celebrate sacred times and are beginning to express our own thoughts about these.</li> <li>I have the confidence to discuss special beliefs that Christians have.</li> </ul>
Year 2	<ul> <li>I can describe how people in different religions celebrate festivals, confidently sharing my ideas as well respecting those of others.</li> <li>I can reflect on what stories and lessons are taught in Holy books. (Bible, Quran, Torah)</li> </ul>
Year 3	<ul> <li>I understand how Christianity is practiced in Britain today.</li> <li>I understand similarities and differences between the main three religions and can explain how their gods are represented in these religions.</li> </ul>
Year 4	<ul> <li>I can confidently discuss important people and features in different religions and make comparisons between them.</li> <li>I can explain why significant religious icons are inspirational to some people and why festivals are important to religious communities.</li> </ul>
Year 5	<ul> <li>I can explore and explain why some people believe God exists and why some people choose to attend a place of worship, confidently sharing our own ideas as well respecting those of others.</li> <li>I can explain what it means to be a Muslim in Britain today, describing how the five pillars impact their lives daily, annually or over their lifetime</li> <li>I can reflect on the forms of guidance pupils turn to when in need.</li> </ul>
Year 6	<ul> <li>I can describe how religions approach difficulties in life, allowing us to confidently discuss our own ideas and concerns.</li> <li>I can identify the values found in stories and texts and give examples of similarities and differences between religions.</li> </ul>
