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Message from Miss Talbot

How well is my child doing?

With the children having now settled into the rhythm of their new school year, this term provides parents with the opportunity to have feedback as to how well their child is getting on at school. The Autumn term reports will come out to parents on **Tuesday 7th November.** The first report of the academic year is a target setting report. Within this report you will have a written overview from your child's teacher describing how they have settled into their new year group. You will also have information about their effort across the curriculum, their attitude to learning and targets to work on. We would then like to welcome you to our book viewing evening on Thursday 9th November. Parents are welcome to drop into school anytime between 3.30 and 7.00 p.m. to have a look at their children's work in the classroom. Children are welcome to come along as well, to show parents all the amazing things they have been doing so far this year. Finally, you have the opportunity to attend a parent consultation appointment with your child's teacher. These appointments will take place on Wednesday 15th November between 3.30 and 5.30 and Tuesday 21st November between 3.30 and 7.30. Further details about all these arrangements will be sent out next week.

If you do have a concern, or something that you would like to discuss with your child's teacher, please don't feel that you need to wait until parents evening. Teachers can be contacted via the year group emails.

Roof Update

It has been lovely to return to a fully functional school hall this term. The marquee was removed over the holiday and this week has seen assemblies, lunch and PE in the hall for the first time since mid June. For our Reception children—it has been the first time that they have been into the hall! We have also now returned to our usual arrangements for drop off at Breakfast Club.

The remaining RAAC has not been removed from the school but the panels have been strengthened to provide secure support. The roof has been assessed by engineers and these areas are safe to use and meet the requirements. We will continue to have regular surveys and assessments whilst we work with the DfE to gain funding for the removal of all remaining RAAC from part of the hall and the surrounding storage rooms.

Once again, thank you to everyone for your support with this issue over the past few months. I am very grateful for the measured and supportive approach taken by our school community in managing this issue.

Attendance

The attendance of pupils at Godinton has always been very good, with average attendance figures above National averages. This reflects how many of our children enjoy school very much and how supportive our families are in promoting good attendance. Our aim is to ensure that this remains the case and to help support families, where we can, who may be struggling with illness or other issues which are impacting on their child's attendance.

At the end of last term, I sent out some information out via ParentMail to help parents in assessing whether their children are well enough to attend school or not. This included links to some useful NHS information.

From term 2, we will be awarding attendance certificates to those children with excellent attendance at three points throughout the year: for attendance of 100% in Term 2, in Term 3 and 4 and in Term 5 and 6. This means that all children have the opportunity to gain a certificate at some point during the year, even if they have a day or two off school as they are unwell.

Good school attendance gives your child the opportunity of greater success and helps develop skills for life. Your child should attend every day unless there is an unavoidable cause such as illness. Missing school damages a child's learning, disrupts routines and can impact on their wellbeing.

Water in Class

All children should have a water bottle in school every day. This should be a clear plastic bottle, no larger than 500ml and should contain only water (unless another arrangement has been made with Miss Talbot). We want to ensure that our children have plenty to drink during the school day, as good hydration is essential for good concentration, however we are noticing that an increasing number of children don't have a bottle.

If a child forgets their bottle, we have plastic cups that they can use. At present these are disposable cups, but as we move to reduce single-use plastics in school, these will no longer be in ready Paper alternatives very supply. are expensive and reusable cups bring issues with washing up so please can I ask for your help is ensuring that the children come to school with a water bottle (don't forget to put their name on it too).
