Reading

Mathletics

There are 14 tasks set for you to complete on Mathletics for this term. Aim to do 2 each week. Please feel free to complete these again even if you have already done so independently this year.

Spellings

Play 'Look, Cover, Write, Check' with the following words. Perhaps focus on 3 each week. Look at the word, trying to remember how to write it, cover it up, write it down and then check you spelt it correctly.

Perhaps you could time yourself to see if you can spell them a little quicker each time!

Interview a member of your family to find out more about them. Think about what questions you are going to ask—perhaps about their childhood or the job that they do now. You might find out something you never knew!

Take any number you like and see how many different things you can do with it. Make calculations to reach that number or perhaps see how many different places you can see it in (in shops, on signs etc.).

Explore the topic of 'Flight' in whatever way you want. You could look at different types of aircraft from aeroplanes to hot air balloons, plan a round the world flight, look at different birds or make something that can fly like a kite.

Fill in the postcard attached to Miss Talbot and your teacher telling them about the things on your trail you have completed.

Can you make a portrait of a person from history out of natural materials that you find outside? Perhaps you could create a picture of Elizabeth I with hair made from leaves or Albert Einstein with a face made from twigs.

Write your own book, short story or comic (with help from a grown up if you need to) in which your family or friends are the main characters. Where will your story be set? What will happen?

This summer sees the Olympic Games taking place in Paris. Make your own Olympic event in your garden, indoors or in the park. What events will you include? Perhaps create your own medals for everyone

Choose one of our Guiding Stars and create an activity to help you develop that skill. Perhaps get together with friends to develop your teamwork skills by making something together or learn a new skill to practice persevering. All our Guiding Stars are on our website.
