It may look like nothing has started since we returned to school, but trust me, it's been busy busy busy! We have been busy

sorting all your wonderful goodies from our first donation day. The Opal Working Party members have been working through our various training courses so we can deliver Opal to the highest possible standards. We've had our grounds meeting with our wonderfully supportive Opal Mentor where we've planned so many different zones of play to develop over the next 2 years. We've had a full staff Twilight meeting where our Opal Mentor explained the whole process and its amazing benefits, to all our teachers, teaching assistants and support staff. We've created our Opal Action Plan, which makes up the strategic plan for implementation and will be followed over the entire 2 year programme. We have set up our

Any painters out there?, Miss Talbot and Mrs Partridge and I will be painting/glamming up some of our existing wooden structures to add a bit of colour and fun to the play zones.
