Weekly homework tasks

Reading

Read or share a book at least five times a week. This could be your 'Big Cat Little Wandle' book, your 'reading for pleasure' or a book from home.

Mathletics

Tasks will be set on Mathletics each week. You can use the games and challenges available on Mathletics as often as you like. The more, the better! Practice addition and subtraction of numbers to 20.

Spellings

Practice a couple of the spellings from spelling lists at the front of your homework book each week.

Practise reading and writing: who, many, school, two, friend, with.

Off on the trail...



You must complete three squares in a row, passing vertically, horizontally or diagonally through the middle square.



The Extra Mile...

Can you complete any 6 squares, including the centre on the grid to get your Extra Mile sticker.



Investigate measurements. Find items of different sizes and compare their lengths. Look at shoes, hand length, how tall you are in comparison to your grown ups. Create a table to show your results.

Enjoy reading some pirate themed books with your loved ones. Can you discuss the differences between fiction and non-fiction? Give examples and write in your homework book.

Design a pirate ship in your book.
Extra challenge: Can you make it? You could use any materials junk modelling, or construction blocks (Lego, Duplo etc). Does it float? You can take pictures or film it.

Draw a treasure map.

Can you label each of the areas. E.g. forest, volcano, cave, beach etc.
Additional idea: Make a pirate pizza map!



Research an animal.

Write a fact file about

- Where it lives
- What it eats
- What type of animal it is
- Interesting facts—min. 2

Marcus Rashford—our term 3 superhero. Who is he and what does he do? Why is he special (not just football!)
Present your findings any way you choose.

Create some animal inspired healthy snacks! E.g. grape caterpillars, banana dolphins etc.
Can you write a set of instruction on how to make it?

Draw a picture of a pirate and label it. What is their name? Think about what they wear and what they carry.

Design a wanted poster for a missing Pirate.
Think about: name, appearance, last seen, what they did wrong and reward.
