Reading

Can you create a picture with labels or sentences describing 2 of your favourite seasons?</p>	<p>In class we have been looking at significant explorers.</p> <p>Can you investigate an Explorer of your own and write about them?</p> <p>Challenge 1: Write a non-fiction fact-file about your chosen person.</p> <p>Challenge 2: Imagine you are that person. Write a postcard home from the place you explored.</p>	<p>Create your own calculation problems linked to animals. For example:</p> <p>There were 3 monkeys in the tree. 7 more came along. How many are there now?</p> <p>Can you draw a picture to match the calculation?</p>
<p>Can you think of an animal for every letter of the alphabet? For example:</p> <p>A for Anteater, B for Butterfly, C for Cat.</p>	<p>Make bird houses/feeders and think about where birds like to live and what birds like to eat.</p>	<p>Animals are either a herbivore, carnivore or an omnivore. Create a mind map detailing different animal types. Include some animal names and what they eat.</p>
