Off on the trail...



You must complete three squares in a row, passing vertically, horizontally or diagonally through the middle square.

In October, we launched our Kindness Month. Design a poster to promote kindness in and out of the classroom. Don't forget to give your top tips. We will give the most inspiring posters to Miss Talbot and Mrs McGibney.

While you are on your travels, look out for living and non-living things around you. Take photos or draw what you see and use MRS GREN to explain how you know whether they are alive or not! You can present your findings however you would like.

Choose a chocolate bar to evaluate. You need to evaluate different aspects including wrapper design, taste, texture, colour and appeal to the audience. You could present this as a write-up, PowerPoint or perhaps you could turn your evaluation into a numbered scale and present your work mathematically.

Create a diorama about the Rainforest, including the different plants and animals that live there. Add labels explaining facts about the climate, where specific animals can be found and different layers. If you don't have art supplies at home, design a poster with the same information.

Imagine you are an animal from the Amazon Rainforest. Describe where you live using your five sense. Please use expanded noun phrases, prepositional phrases, similes and metaphors. Can you use these as sentence openers?

As part of our STAR week we have learnt that some people believe deities represent different qualities and attributes for example Ganesha is the Hindu god of wisdom. Design your own deity to represent a quality that is important to you and write a short explanation of how they show this quality.

Create a model of the human digestive system. Show how a piece of food journey's through each organ. You could take a photo of your design or record the journey with commentary, giving information about the processes that happen inside each organ.

Think about our class hero this term, Jacques Cousteau. Research who he is, why he is famous and explain how he shows our Godinton STAR values. You can present your information however you want including a PowerPoint presentation, a poster or in your book.

In school, we will be creating adventure stories to find new flavours for confectionary. Design a new chocolate bar or sweet wrapper that has incredible flavours from faraway worlds. You may like to use surrealist style designs and flavours from the Amazon.
