We have very much enjoyed developing our playtimes over the past year, providing so many exciting activities for our children to enjoy. From mud kitchens, to scooter runs, den building to dressing up—we have tried to include something for everyone and are always on the look out for other resources or activities we can introduce to further enhance playtimes. The impact of the changes we have made, has been significant. We have seen our children being more imaginative and creative, they have developed problem solving skills and have demonstrated really good abilities to share and take turns. There is a very positive vibe outside at lunchtimes which has been great to see.

In order to give Upper School and Lower School children the opportunity to play together, every week, each Upper School year group will have an earlier lunch, joining Lower School at 11.30 for lunch in the hall, followed by playtime outside: Tuesday—Year 5, Wednesday—Year 6 and Thursday—Year 4. We are also looking forward to parents and relatives joining in with a lunch play in the next few weeks. This term, Years 2 to 6 will have the opportunity to involve their parents in the activities they enjoy doing at playtime and later in the year, it will be the turn of years R and 1.

We start with Year 2 and 5 parents who join us on the 24th and 25th September— we look forward to seeing you then.

Our New Play Charter

If you pop into school for a play session, you will see our lovely new play charter in place. This has been drawn up by our Mini Management Team and outlines the expectations for happy playtimes at Godinton.



WOW-Walk to School

We were delighted to have been awarded funding to enable us to participate in the Living Streets WOW Walk to School initiative again this academic year. scheme is designed to encourage children to walk, cycle, scooter or park and stride to school and to reduce the number of car runs. If the children use one of these methods to travel to school at least once a week each month, then they will be rewarded with a special WOW badge. This year, there are new badges for the children to collect each month. The children record their journeys on a special online tracker which is completed in class each morning. We have also been awarded a grant of £5,000 to develop our cycle storage at Godinton. Our cycle shed is in desperate need of a make over so that we can safely accommodate more bikes and scooters. We hope to make a start on the work in October Half Term and with Bikeability cycle training starting for Year 4 and 6 in November, we hope they will soon be put to good use.

Changes to Reports and Parent Consultations

I have sent out to parents, details of the changes we are making this academic year with regards to reports and Parent Consultations. Thank you again to all those parents who responded to our questionnaire—this has really helped us to gauge parental views and to shape a more informative way forward.

Priorities for this Academic Year

Our School Improvement Plan for the year ahead has been finalised and identifies key areas for the school to focus on in 2025-2026.

Academic priorities this year, include developing children's enjoyment of reading and their opportunities for reading for pleasure both at home and at school. Encouraging your child to read at home, or to share books with you everyday is essential in developing their reading ability which in turn impacts on their writing—both sentence structure and vocabulary. Across the school, but particularly in Lower and Middle School, we are also focusing on extending children's writing abilities and from Year 3 upwards, consolidating children's recall of times tables.

Outside of the curriculum, we will be implementing our Climate Action Plan which identifies ways in which we can support and develop environmental priorities at Godinton. I am looking forward to working with our Climate Action Crew who will be helping with a number of initiatives over the year.

Healthy Eating

Just a reminder that the children are only able to bring a piece of fruit or vegetables to school for their morning snack. This could be a whole pieces of fruit e.g. apple, banana or pear or pieces of fruit or vegetables in a small pot e.g. grapes and strawberries or pieces of carrot and cucumber. No other snacks are permitted unless your child has a particular dietary need and this has ben discussed with either myself or Mrs Stein.

The children are only allowed to bring water to school in their water bottle. The children have access to their bottles throughout the day and regular drinking is encouraged.

Our cook, Jo, and her team from Independent Catering, provide excellent school dinners each day. Remember that a school meal is provided free of charge for every child in Years R, 1 and 2. This includes a hot or cold meal, dessert and access to the salad bar. Menus are on the school website so that you can help your child to choose their lunch each day. If you would rather your child brings a packed lunch to school please ensure that this is a healthy balanced lunch. Sweets and chocolate bars are not allowed and we would encourage fruit or vegetables to be included.

On Thursday 2nd October we have our special superhero lunch as it is school census day. The amount of children in Years R, 1 and 2 who have a school lunch on that day impacts on our school funding so we would encourage as many children as possible to have a lunch on this day. Full details of menu choices this day are on the school website.

New Starters 2026

Although we have only just welcomed this year's new starters to Godinton, we are already starting to think about our 2026-27 cohort.
