If you have a child due to start school in September 2026, don't forget that your application for a place for your child needs to be submitted to KCC by Thursday 15th January. If you are looking for a place at Godinton and already have another child at the school you are likely to have a sibling link which will place you higher up the offer list in the event that we are over-subscribed. However if you have moved more than 2 miles away from the school since your first child was enrolled at Godinton, then the sibling link will be broken. This means that in the event of the school being over-subscribed you would be considered for a place on the basis of distance. Please contact the school office if you think this may apply to you and they will be able to offer advice.

Venture Camps Gymnastics
