<p>Design a poster, encouraging people from the Caribbean to emigrate to the UK in the late 1940s.</p>	<p>You have inherited £1million pounds, but can only keep £200,000. The rest has to 'make a difference' to others. Explain what you would do with it, using software if you wish.</p>	<p>Research a force that we have not studied in class; e.g. magnets or friction. Conduct an experiment to show its effects in action, and report your findings.</p>
